Brian joins the reps from 5 other regions and this initiative concludes the governance amendments that were implemented in 2024 for the National Vinnies Board.



# WELFARE AT VINNIES




Welfare demand at Vinnies during 2024 continued at a similar level to the previous year. We received some 8,600 requests during 2024 from families and households in need that resulted in nearly 9,700 separate requests being managed that were valued at over \$1 million

When these families and households were contacted - these needs represented support for adults and children. In addition to supporting families and households in various ways, Vinnies also have a 'school's assistance programme' where Vinnies assists a number of schools each year. This support includes the payment of school/activity fees, provision of school uniforms, assisting with IT equipment and ....

# Vinnies National AGM

I came away from the National AGM inspired to carry the important messages that were discussed and debated over the two days at Tauranga. This was my first AGM and I found the discussions during the break times to be very useful for making new contacts and putting names to faces.

At first I imagined that the first day was mainly concerned with housekeeping but looking over my rough notes there were areas which went beyond that. In particular Frank Brassil's commentaries and sharing of his thoughts about how we operate SVdP in New Zealand with his thoughts and views seeming to resonate with the wider group.

A Health and Safety report was timely and reminded us of our duty of care not only for our clients but also for ourselves as SVdP volunteers. I liked the suggestion that conference meetings should set aside a safety moment. I'd like to know more about this and how we might exercise this during our meetings.

The shop system, bank accounts issues, a relook at Rules Part 3 as well as acknowledgement of the importance of youth input have been, no doubt, visited before but were important talking points.

The Australian representative, Frank Brassil, outlined a number of challenges to our New Zealand situation.

He suggested that we have a flawed governance structure because the National Council is too big. Twenty-one on the National Council is too big for getting consensus. Frank also said that the Council should be meeting monthly instead of twice a year. In Australia, the shops were taken over by their National Council who appointed a National Retail Manager. This resulted in standardising the layout & branding with the shops doubling their profits. This option should be seriously considered in New Zealand. As well as shop issues, there were deemed to be too many bank accounts. Whilst this number has reduced in recent years, the number of accounts is still too large. In the Treasurer's view the ideal would be "one bank account with sub-accounts" that should suffice for each Area Council". This will also encourage conferences to see themselves as more unified and not so much as separate entities. The Xero accounting software should be utilised across all conferences.


The theme of the AGM was 'Refounding'. This theme was teased out more thoroughly on the Sunday by Gerry Stevens who outlined his thoughts in a written piece which he shared with the meeting. In essence, refounding is a way of being able to rediscover the Mission of the Society.

The impetus for this process is particularly driven by the realisation that our membership has fallen drastically in the last IO years. There is no one reason for this but a number of factors are contributing. Membership has fallen alongside a parallel decline in church attendance with many baptised Catholics no longer practising their faith. The AGM discussed these issues. The ways in which 'Refounding' can be implemented was discussed and an "Action Plan" developed. Details will be published when received from our National Office.



# Obituaries

Claude Sissons - Claude was a Vincentian at Stella Maris for some years and was one of the early residents at Nazareth House in Christchurch. He was actively involved in the activities of the village and spent some time setting up the Residents Association at Nazareth. Claude was highly respected for his great organisational skills and enjoyed being a part of the Walking group and the Merrymakers. I got to know Claude in the years he was both Area Treasurer and Board member under the reign of Mike Daly as Area President. Claude also supported our fundraising activities, and it was great to see him again at the official opening and blessing by Bishop Michael of the Ozanam apartments in Pavitt Street in 2023.



Claude passed away on 24 February 2025 after an illness and had a great send off at his requiem mass on 4th March. His sons Hamish and Daryl both spoke very highly of Claude, not only about all his achievements during his life but his attitude to life which was always positive plus his great love of family. Thank you, Claude for all your great work for Vinnies over the many years. May you rest in peace.

#### Rodger Hodgins - RIP by John Doocey

Many of us have enjoyed Rodger Hodgins company and news of his death has caused great sadness. Rodger began his Vincentian time as a volunteer at the Papanui shop. His skill at repairing things, in particular his talent with furniture, was a great asset. After a few years at Papanui, Rodger answered an SOS to work on the truck. He collected many gifts from those donating goods to the Society and took great joy in meeting these folks in their homes. Discussing their gardens, their families and viewing tool sheds, Rodger was always grinning and yarning with those he meet. His best efforts however were in his interactions with those referred by conference members in need of assistance.

Rodger had known a few hiccups in life, most notably a motorcycle accident that left him with daily discomfort and ended his career.

Rodger understood the difficulty those he meet faced in their challenges. His empathy and care for those he served at Vinnies has left a great legacy.

Rodger did his work quietly, never talked of his pain and has left all the better for having met him. Please remember Rodger, his son and his daughter in your prayers. Rest in peace Rodger!
