

## **Celebration of Feast Day of St Vincent de Paul**

### 27 September

A large group of Vincentians celebrated the Feast Day of St Vincent de Paul at St Gregory's church on Friday 27th September. Mass was celebrated by Fr Chris Orr who spoke of the inspiring work of St Vincent and that he was the Patron of Charitable Societies. He was born into a poor family in 1580 and after being ordained as a priest, devoted himself to the poor.

Fr Chris explained the five Missionary Virtues – (i) Simplicity – in the lifestyle that one leads & the need to speak a simple Gospel message that people understand; (ii) Humility – emptying oneself of pride, and having an attitude of thankfulness & dependence on God; (iii) Mortification – allowing somethings to die within you in order that those that matter most can flourish; (iv) Meekness – channel our anger so it becomes a positive force for good; (v) Zeal – a longing that people might find life & purpose from relationship with Jesus – it arises through our own conversion. At the end of Mass, over 25 (mostly) new Vincentians were commissioned with members promising to support and pray for these newly commissioned members. Mike Daly (National Vice President) provided the newly commissioned members with their Vincentian badges.

Our operations are busy - there is big demand for furniture, bedding and clothing. The last few months have been constant, and we continue to hear some unfortunate stories of hardship - a sad reality presently. Some of the exciting things happening are a new website, the completion of the staff education program, and finally both Cyrene and myself were commissioned into Vinnies. Thank you to those that help us but to everyone, now is the time that we need your help to put our words into action. At the end of November ww will have the Christmas ghetto which will need funding or donations of presents for Children, plus at Christmas, demand will be very significant.

Over the last 12-18 months, Vinnies has provided some training for its staff. With funding sourced from Education Unlimited, Conquest Training providing the facilitation and training all staff went through the sessions in groups over a 10 week period with each session taking 4 hours. Some of the topics covered included Vinnies policies, our culture, Health & Safety, conflict resolution, and technology. Amongst some of the successes were members from the Ashburton team who had joined us on these courses. Of interest, several staff have continued on with their own personal learning journey.

Congratulations to everyone and in particular well done to Teresa and Wayne who have chosen to undertake this extra learning.

# Vinnies Youth/Young Adults Update-

#### Term 3 school visits

I had a great response with our lesson regarding 'Laudato Si' and supporting the environment. A few schools have created their very own vegetable and fruit garden with Young Vinnies looking after them. The key take away for our Young Vinnies is not just helping and supporting the poor in our community but also taking practical steps to be involved in protecting and preserving the health of the environment we live in as Young Vinnies.

Term 4 is all about appreciation of the work of the Young Vinnies this year. I'll also focus on the gospel message in 1 Timothy 4:12 "...do not let anyone look down on you because you are young" and challenge them to strive and become "More" which is a reflection from John 10:10 "...I came so that they may have life and have life to full", as Christ intends.

#### Can Drive and Fundraising Appeals

Can Drive for term 3 generated 3,511 cans collected with an estimated total value of \$10, 533. Other schools who participated gave their cans to their respective Conferences directly, among those was St. Bede's College with a massive contribution of 1,400 cans estimating at \$4,200 worth of value.

**Christ The King School Young Vinnies** held a fundraising raffle and raised \$902 for Young Vinnies. Tegel Chicken have sponsored the prizes with St. Vincent de Paul contributing 3x Warehouse Gift Cards and a box of chocolates.

**Villa Maria College Young Vinnies** is organising a Fashion Show Fundraising Event to help raise funds for St Vincent de Paul to continue the work we do for the community. This event encourages young people to get involved in advocating and volunteering for a charity. Our aim is to raise more than \$3,000 to fund St Vincent de Paul projects heading into the Christmas Season that will provide food parcels, clothing and Christmas presents for the people we support in our community. We have amazing sponsors who contributed to our main raffle and spot prize draws, with our Conferences chipping in for the 1st Major Raffle prize – Thank you.






# Vinnies in Canterbury has a new website

Our new website address is svdpcanterbury.nz

Our purpose for this initiative is to create a website that is readily findable, accessible and useable for clients seeking help. And, very importantly, to be readily findable, accessible, useable, informative and attractive to people who may be wanting to help us - potential volunteers, members, donors of money, donors of food, goods and furniture, writers of wills, philanthropic organisations that consider grant applications. Plus, the site can be more easily and regularly updated

The website contains plenty of opportunities for people to donate currently via the 'Givealittle' donations platform. By late October, we are intending to upgrade this to something more suited to our current needs. In addition, we will continue to add new content such as the annual reports for Canterbury.

# **Financial Counselling**

The Society has been offering its clients this service for approximately five years and our conferences are making clients aware of this service. Generally, a household budget is prepared and advice is offered on year round financial planning and ensuring all income entitlements are being received.

Other household financial burdens, such as debt repayments or arrears of rent/electricity etc can be tackled to ease stresses in dealing with overbearing organisations and institutions. Repayment arrangements can be a solution which relieves anxiety and satisfies the creditor.

More extreme debt solutions involve Kiwisavings Hardship Withdrawals and Insolvency procedures. Both of these solutions are comprehensive, and are not entered into lightly, involving a lot of form filling and complex enquiries.

Over the last year the number of referrals I have received has noticeably increased because of the "cost of living" increases and clients unable to cope with the need to request food and other Welfare assistance. Recently I have been asked to help with Kiwisavings Hardship withdrawals and deal with officious power companies. I also was able to congratulate a young woman who is a recovering drug addict, getting a full time job and is handling her household finances most efficiently.

Sadly, while the conferences and members are making referrals many clients will not engage in budgeting. There are a number of reasons why they won't engage, mainly because of complacency, it's not a priority, or because they don't want to disclose their financial position. In some cases because they feel they have an entitlement. Currently ONLY 1 out of 10 referrals will engage.

Conferences now have letters they can use to tag the client Zoho notes that the client is not engaging to receive help with their financial position in an attempt to make the client self sufficient, rather than continually relying on Vinnies Welfare assistance. However, conferences should provide assistance in deserving cases at their absolute discretion.
